#### October 6 Saying The Hardest Word Taylor and Cooke

The Jewish High Holy days are a excellent time for non-Jews to also notice and attend to the work of forgiveness and reconnection. This First Sunday, with the theme of "Deep Listening" will be our invitation into the season. (Join us after service for Workshops!)

#### October 13 Hope for the Holy Land - Prophets Among Us: Don and Maya Peretz Rev. Gary Doupe

Don Peretz taught Middle East Studies at SUNY-Binghamton from 1966-1992, retiring as Professor Emeritus. His doctoral dissertation was the first ever written about the plight of Palestinian refugees, following World War II and the declaration of the State of Israel as a political entity. Don, a pacifist, served in the U.S. Army and later volunteered with AFSC (the Quakers) to help resettle Palestinians in northern Israel. Don's wife Maya was a Jewish child born in Poland as the Holocaust was taking shape, and protected from harm by a Catholic family.

#### October 20 The Great Web Laine and Taylor

Our annual partnership service has Rev. Darcey and Rev. Douglas thinking about the many ways living beings are connected with one another in the great web of life. Together we celebrate the many subtle ways beings impact, support and depend on one another, in a web that holds us all.


#### **New Sanctuary Sound System**

Twenty five years ago, when Whitney Herriage was called to be our minister, we raised funds for a new sound system. It's had a few repairs and a couple components were replaced, but it's been very good. But before it dies of old age, we decided to replace most of the equipment now rather than waiting for a crisis. So it's happening in October!

Earlier this year we submitted a grant request to the New York State Convention of Universalists (NYSCU) to help fund this renovation and we received a grant of \$2,200. Combined with funds leftover from our streaming system, we are able to get this new system.

The new system will give us greater reliability and flexibility, especially since we now have two audiences — one in our sanctuary and the other on Zoom. Those with hearing difficulties will be able to use an app on their phone & hear our services through their hearing aids. And our tech crew will be able to adjust all the audio from a laptop in addition to the controls at the back of the sanctuary.

#### **Adult Choir is Seeking New Members**


There is nothing more uplifting than being part of a vocal community, and the choir's contribution is a vital part of our Sunday worship together.

#### New Virtual Hymnal



The UUA has a task force to design and build a virtual hymnal! Their vision is "to build a living collection of song resources through an accessible, equitable, online platform grounded in UU values." The virtual hymnal will be full of resources never before available. In addition to the hymns, virtual sheet music will be available for different instruments and in different keys. Historical resources on each hymn will be included. Copyright permissions will be done. Slides will be available for congregations to display in their sanctuaries and online. Very exciting!

This task force asked for congregational teams to apply to beta test this new hymnal, so Jeff Donahue, Douglas Taylor and Vicky Gordon applied ... and we were accepted! We will review all these new features this fall. In December the task force will begin accepting recommendations for new hymns. The virtual hymnal will be unveiled next June at General Assembly in Baltimore.
