## Our Congregation's Social Action Focus for this year... Here is what we are doing!

#### **Bus Pass Project**

UUCB has collected and donated \$450 to bus passes given out by Houseless Outreach Team at the bus station and an additional \$500 has been donated to Family Enrichment Network (FEN).

#### **Systemic Housing**

Grants & Loans for Southern Door Community Land Trust (SDCLT):

- helped secure an interest free loan of \$100,000 from NYSCU;
- helped write a NYSDEC grant;
- helped write a City of Binghamton Community
   Development Block Grant (CDBG) application;
- working to consider a NYS Homes & Community Renewal grant.

Total Amt. Raised for *Southern Door Community Land Trust* so far this year is \$5354.11


#### **Education**

#### **Houseless Outreach Team**

Volunteers go out every Tuesday evening to hand out donations to our houseless community members. While it varies quite a bit depending on weather, law enforcement actions, and other factors, there are generally 12 to 25 people that we help each week. In addition, we often have individuals dropped off at the bus station after hours by the BC Sheriff's office after their arraignments. These individuals are often in need of warm clothing and food.



The congregation has been very generous in putting donations into the Giving Box and making use of the Amazon Wish List, using it to directly order donation items or as inspiration for purchasing donations from other resources. If the two boxes are cleaned out on a Tuesday night, invariably there will be new items in the box on Wednesday.

Our October First Sunday workshop provided bagged meals to distribute and Blessing Bags with socks and other needed items for distribution. The Blessing Bags are being used as a springboard to expand houseless outreach to a second location in Endicott.

### UUCB Mutual Aid Grocery Buddy System: November & December

We are excited to launch a confidential, short-term initiative rooted in our values of community care and mutual support: the UUCB Mutual Aid Grocery Buddy System.

This system allows congregants to confidentially offer grocery support to fellow congregants who need it during the coming holiday months.

#### How It Works

This initiative operates as a completely confidential buddy system:

**Register:** Congregants register as either a Giver or a Recipient using the appropriate Google Form.

**Donate:** Givers purchase a set, bi-weekly amount on a Visa or Mastercard gift card (details below).

**Submit:** Givers give the gift card(s) to Catherine Magdala.

**Match:** Catherine confidentially matches Givers and Recipients and distributes the funds.

**Privacy:** Givers and Recipients will not know each other's identities. Only Douglas Taylor and Catherine Magdala will have access to the names and amounts

#### ? Recipient Instructions

If you are a UUCB congregant needing temporary grocery support for November and December:

**Prioritization:** You do not need to be a SNAP recipient to receive support. However, to ensure the funds go to those with the most critical need, SNAP recipients will be prioritized during the matching process. After SNAP recipients have been taken care of, matches are prioritized based on intersectionality.

Catherine Magdala will confidentially contact you and arrange the bi-weekly distribution of the matched gift cards.

If you wish to register as a Giver, please follow these strict guidelines:

#### 💳 Giver Instructions & Key Rules

Eligibility: Participation (giving or receiving) is strictly limited to UUCB congregants only.

**R**equired Payment: Only Visa or Mastercard gift cards are accepted.

NO grocery store cards, Amazon cards, online payments, cash, or checks.

Marking Cards: Do not write any names on the gift card. Only write the dollar amount clearly on the card.

Submission: Submit the gift card(s) directly to Catherine Magdala. She will provide you with a receipt at the time of your donation.

# Memorial Service at UUCB for Peter Herman


We will have a memorial service for Debby Herman's husband Peter on Saturday, November 15 at 2pm in the sanctuary.

Our disbursements, as codified in our bylaws, focus on 1. Capital improvements to Congregation property. 2. Community outreach programs, such as local nonprofit organizations. 3. Educational grants, such as developing Congregation leadership and student activities, and 4. Wider mission, such as the Unitarian Universalist Service Committee. These are accomplished through annual requests for grant proposals from the UUCB congregation. # Zoom Discussion Series in November with Alex Compton An Introduction to Transformative Justice

November 5, 12, 18 On Zoom, 7:00-8:30

Congregations across the US are looking at Abolition and Faith Formation as a part of our current Congregation Study and Action Issue. This three part discussion will provide a foundation for understanding Transformative Justice which is at the root of abolition.

Mia Mingus says that "Transformative Justice is a political framework and approach for responding to violence, harm and abuse. At its most basic, it seeks to respond to violence without creating more violence and/or engaging in harm reduction to lessen the violence."

Discussion one will take a look at adrienne maree brown's Emergent Strategies (selections will be provided for those who do not with to read the whole book)

Discussion two will discuss Mia Mingus's "Transformative Justice: A Brief Description" https://transformharm.org/tj\_resource/transformative-justice-a-brief-description/

Discussion three will close us out with brown's We Will Not Cancel Us which brings the conversation around TJ and abolition to the small group/interpersonal level
